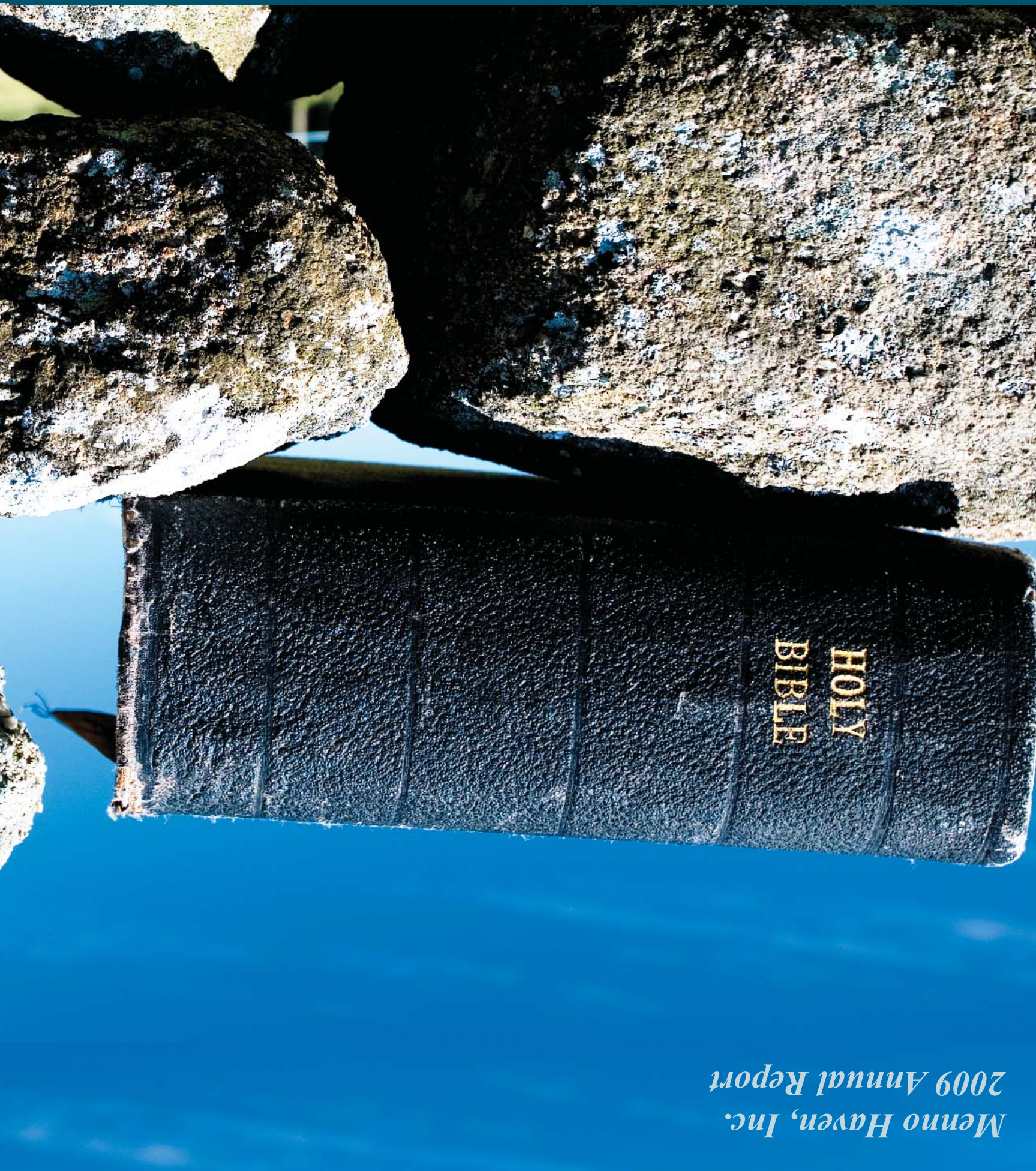

## A Strong Foundation when Facing Adversity.

In years to come, we will remember back in the "good ole days" and remark about the terrible recession in the early turn of the century. Many of us will remember that 2009 was a trying year, a year where many people did not have work and many organizations struggled to survive if they did at all. Those of us associated with Menno Haven will also have the pleasant memory of knowing that we were able to ride the storm and actually improve our business through a tumultuous era.

Over the years, we have been diligently growing our campuses; building new areas where services can be received and new areas where residents can reside. But in 2009, we faced a year that was not filled with construction or start up of new operations. We had tremendous momentum and we were not about to lose that momentum just because we had no construction. We refocused our energies and resources to concentrate inward on our business - more on the innate/historical part of our business, strengthening the roots.

To many, the lack of outward growth may appear that the organization

becomes stagnate but these are the most important years. We looked at our efficiencies and policies and questioned how we could take a step closer to excellence. Focusing on our staff, we implemented SilverChair, a computerized training program that allows employees to participate in training at their leisure. This 21st century type of training was a huge success and we completed the year with a remarkable 99.4 percent completion rate. Focusing on our operations, much efficiency was gained by introducing Electronic Health Records to our health care areas. The business program allows staff to quickly enter information so that they can ultimately spend more time with residents and because of its all encompassing nature it promotes quality of care, correct billing, compliance and reduction of errors, while ultimately enhancing our ability to maximize our reimbursement. Focusing on our future, the board approved a master plan that led to the reduction of all three and four bed bedrooms in our Menno Village Nursing Center - enhancing our provision of a greater dignity of care. Further enhancement to this area lies just ahead!



Focusing on our business, the year ended with consolidation of the Menno Haven Penn Hall, Inc. into Menno Haven, Inc. As of January 1, 2010, all entities are officially owned and operated by Menno Haven, Inc. We focused on strengthening our relationships, values and options through a plethora of programming including the first 5k Run/Walk for Alzheimers', the Spirituality and Aging Conference, appreciation events, and outreach into our community.

Yes, often strength and viability are metered upon the amount of physical growth that an organization might exhibit. We firmly believe, however, that just as much metering should be given to the amount of internal review, focus and nurturing of existing program and design - nurture the roots and strengthen the "foundation"! 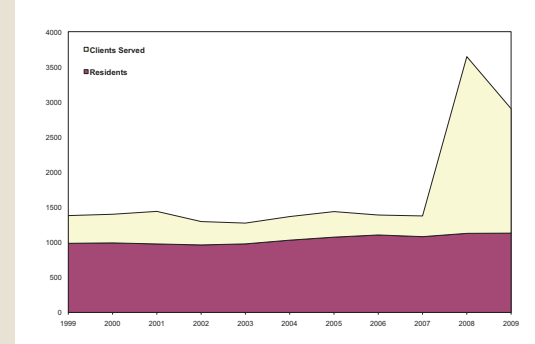
## Financial Stability in Difficult Times.

This past year had been challenging for Menno Haven and other providers in the senior living industry. Due to the sagging economy in 2009, Menno Haven was challenged by decreases in the census in the nursing and personal care facilities. There were substantial increases in the costs associated with the financial derivative relating to a bond issue. In addition, cottages and apartment turnovers were affected by the nation's housing downturn. Prospective residents were unable to sell their main residence. This housing downturn contributed to an increase in vacant cottage/apartment units.

year in a favorable financial position. Benchmarking, process reviews and stringent budgetary controls were implemented throughout the organization to meet the economic challenges. As a result, Menno Haven's managers and staff operated with expenses well below those budgeted for 2009. The substantial reduction in operating expenses offset the reductions in revenues.

### Residents & Other Clients Served



Net assets of the organization increased \$9.8 million. The unrealized gain on investments and a change in the fair value of derivatives were responsible

for \$8.2 million of the increase in the net assets. The cash and cash equivalents increased \$2.3 million. The operating income increased \$2.2 million as compared to the previous year. Menno Haven funded the purchase of \$858,000 in property and equipment with internal financing. Electronic medical records were installed and phases 1 & 2 were implemented at both nursing facilities in 2009.

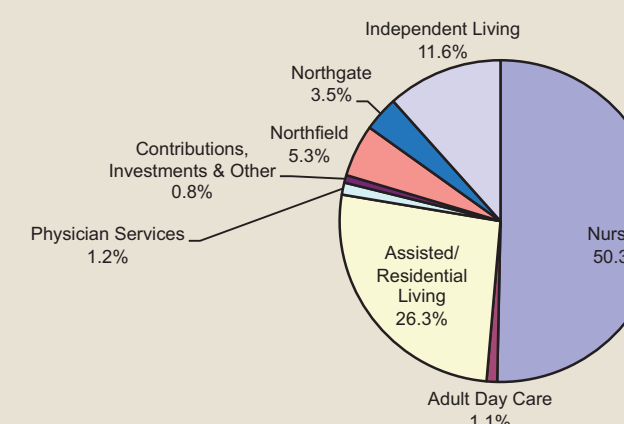
Menno Haven provided \$698,000 of benevolent care to non nursing center residents who could no longer pay the full fees associated with their care. The total charity care provided by Menno Haven to those receiving benevolent care, medical assistance and the estimated value of volunteer hours was \$3.9 million for 2009.

Due to the favorable financial results, Menno Haven met all bond covenants for 2009.

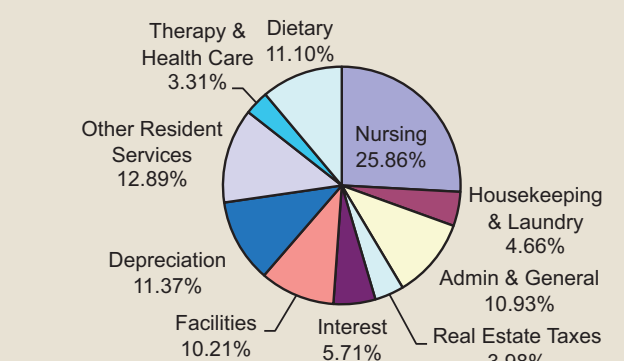

During the 2009 Annual Auxiliary Banquet, the Menno Haven Auxiliary presented a check to the communities for more than \$49,000.

In 2009 the activities that supported the fundraising efforts included selling ham loaves, pork barbecue, and beautiful flowers. Members continue to work in The Treasure Chest thrift store at Menno Village, the Menno Village Gift Shop, the Penn Hall Glass House, and Convenience Stores providing shopping experiences for residents, staff, as well as a service to the community. The goal to raise funds has been further enhanced by presenting the Third Annual Auxiliary Quilt Show in October where quilts were displayed and purchased.

The Auxiliary also supports current resident needs by helping to fund equipment necessary for the betterment of the community. Motivated by a mission to "brighten the lives of residents and lighten the load of employees" the auxiliary donated funding for an aviary in the dementia unit, wheelchair scales, electric steamer trays in the nursing center, recliners for ElderDay Services, Nustep Cross Trainer, dining room chairs, projector, speakers, screen, and a full body lift for the campuses.

The Auxiliary cares for Menno Haven residents directly by giving "Prayer Bears" to new nursing and assisted living residents at each campus. The Auxiliary also sponsors the "Memory Roses" placed in the lobby areas in honor of the life of residents at the time of death.
